

Pupil Premium 2016/17

What is pupil premium?

“The Government believes that the Pupil Premium, which is additional to main school funding, is the best way to address the current underlying inequalities between children eligible for free school meals (FSM) and their wealthier peers by ensuring that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches the pupils who need it most.

In most cases the Pupil Premium is allocated to schools and is clearly identifiable. It is for schools to decide how the Pupil Premium, allocated to schools per FSM pupil, is spent, since they are best placed to assess what additional provision should be made for the individual pupils within their responsibility.” (DfE website)

How much was allocated to Brabourne CE Primary School?

In 2016/17: £9240

How was the allocation used last year?

- Teacher employed to teach specific pupils in after-school/lunchtime booster sessions
- Additional hours for TA support for interventions
- Extra resources for specific groups of pupils (such as SEN)
- Helping pupils receiving the premium with funding for uniform, trips, swimming lessons, or any other school activities which may involve a financial cost or voluntary contribution
- Helping finance some out of school activities which enrich learning eg dance clubs, music tuition, etc.
