Topic

In History, the children will become time travellers, travelling back in time to changes within their living memory and then to the the Great Fire of London, being beyond their living memory. We will look at how the Great Fire of London started, particularly the type of houses built during this time as well as the chronology of events during the Fire.

In Geography we will be looking at photographs and maps of Brabourne School and beyond recognising key landmarks. We will also be looking at keys and compass directions. We will visit The Street in Brabourne to look at the different types of houses and how they are made. We will make observations and record our findings.

RE

This unit is about the lessons and messages taught through a selection of Parables (stories) such as The Good Samaritan, The Lost Sheep, The Lost Coin, The Great Feast and the Two Builders.

PE – Hockey

Children will learn basic hockey skills including how to dribble with a hockey stick, be able to pass a ball accurately, to be able to pass the ball whilst moving and how to shoot.

Materials and their Properties

The children will:

- Identify a variety of common materials
- Distinguish between objects and the material they are made from.
- Describe the properties of materials
- To be able to describe why some materials suit certain objects better than others
- Carry out an investigation on the best waterproof material to use to build a roof for the Three Little Pigs

- Looking at the features of houses during the Great Fire of London and making replicas for our display.
- Designing and building our own type of house
- Cooking for our Little Pigs tea party

Maths – Place Value, Addition and Subtraction**Number – Place Value**

- Read and write numbers in numerals and in words.
- Recognise the place value of each digit in a two digit number (tens, ones)
- Identify, represent and estimate numbers using different representations including the number line.
- Compare and order numbers; use <, > and = signs.
- Use place value and number facts to solve problems.
- Count in steps of 2, 3 and 5 from 0, and in tens from any number, forward and backward.

Number – Addition and Subtraction

- Recall and use addition and subtraction facts to 10 and 20 fluently, and derive and use related facts up to 100.
- Add and subtract numbers using concrete objects, pictorial representations, and mentally, including: 1 digit numbers to 10; a two-digit number and ones; a two-digit number and tens; two two-digit numbers; adding three one-digit numbers.
- Show that the addition of two numbers can be done in any order (commutative) and subtraction of one number from another cannot.
- Solve problems with addition and subtraction: using concrete objects and pictorial representations, including those involving numbers, quantities and measures; applying their increasing knowledge of mental and written methods.
- Recognise and use the inverse relationship between addition and subtraction and use this to check calculations and solve missing number problems
