

Year $\frac{3}{4}$ Revise and review.

English

Reading: Challenge yourself to read at least once every day. Share as much of your reading with an adult at home as you can, and answer their questions about the storyline and the characters. You could write a review of a story book you have listen to in class. Alternatively, create a non-chronological report to summarise an information text you have enjoyed—this could be a book or an online article.

Writing: We focused on the book, 'The Hedgehog.' You could write a diary entry based on the Lollypop Lady who let the hedgehogs cross the street at her stop. You could research Hedgehogs and write a non-chronological report all about this amazing creatures.

Spelling: Have a go at these spelling games that focus on the Year 3 and 4 statutory word list.

PHSE

Community and Care: Investigate the science of immunisation and vaccinations. Create a short explanation text or poster for children about these processes and their importance.

There have been several interesting T.V. programmes on plastic pollution recently such as the Deadly 60 CBBC. Produce a poster or power point about this threat to local and marine wildlife.

Take a plastic bottle. Cut it in half. Put soil in the bottom half. Plant some seeds, perhaps tomato seeds you might be having some for lunch. Add water to the soil. Slide the top half of the bottle over the bottom. Hopefully you should have created a biome which should show the water cycle. Draw diagrams each week to show what is happening.

Science

Record all the different solutions and mixtures you encounter at home in a diary for one day, using these key terms: *solution, mixtures, soluble, insoluble, particles, substance, dissolve*. Be sure to include labelled diagrams. Here are some scenarios to get you thinking: making a cup of tea, making cereal, running a bath, washing up.

Record all the different changes of state which occur around the house. This might include a liquid changing into a gas when the kettle is switched on or melting during cooking. How many examples can you find.

We learnt about how fossils were created over time and the fossil hunter Mary Anning. Produce a labelled diagram about how fossils are made.

History

We have covered many topics so far this year which include life in the trenches and life on the home front. Research a famous figure from World War 1 such as the Red Baron, Winston Churchill or Lord Kitchener and produce a comic book about what they did or achieve during this time.

Produce a cross section diagram of a World War 1 trench.

Research the new weapons from this time period, producing either labelled diagrams showing each one or a timeline showing when each one was invented.

Geography


Research Ordnance Survey Maps and the symbols which you can find on them. Produce a detailed map of your local village, area or somewhere you love just like an O.S. map.
