

Year $\frac{3}{4}$ Hogwarts or Star Wars enrichment.

Hogwarts.

I want you to write a diary. We have done this in class. If you remember we wrote a diary based on the 'Wimpy kid' series of books. If you are a Hogwarts fan then I want you to re-read the chapter (or what the film) when Harry Potter and his friends travel to Hogwarts for the first time. Harry wasn't the only child and I can imagine many were amazed at seeing the 'boy who lived,' as well as the train journey. Once you have done this write a diary covering that first day. Draw some doodles to show the badges, people, places or sweets you might have seen. Hot tip - If you have a child who struggles to write and you have an i-pad then this might help. On i-pads and i-phones there is an app called notes. If you open this app you will see on the keyboard a microphone symbol. Press that and it acts as a dictaphone. Your child will talk into it and the app will write it. If they say full stop then it will put in the correct punctuation.

Maths This Maths problem would be done over a couple of sessions in class. It is an investigation so the depth you explore it is up to you.

Problem

After hours of reading about potions you realise that you spent too much time messing about and you will not pass! So you have spent the last couple of hours creating a potion which will help you get a perfect score in the exam. The recipe, which makes enough for three students, requires 8 fairy wings and 12 drops of dragon blood.

1. How much would you need to create enough potion for 6 and then 9 students?
2. If you had 48 fairy wings, how much dragon blood would you need?
3. How many doses of potion could you make with these ingredients?
4. How many fairy wings would you need for 24 students.?

I thought I would create this enrichment document as an alternative. This situation is affecting every child and family differently. In my village some children seem to love the 8 hours of work which is sent out by the local Primary School each day. Others are being reduced to tears.

I don't want any child to cry over the thought of doing work at home and so I have created this enrichment document for any family who has a child who may be refusing to work or struggling to follow the curriculum work.

This is designed to pick up on popular themes I noticed around the classroom and hopefully through using them, it might make home learning a little easier.

My first two themes are Star Wars and Hogwarts. If anyone decides to do this then e-mail the office with ideas for themes such as 'horses, or the A-Team' and I will produce more to help.

Every wand is unique in the Harry Potter world. Each wand has a history and is made from a special wood or contains a special material. Your task is to design your own wand. You will have to research what type of wood to use, what colour it is and whether it is a hard wood or soft so it might bend. What length is it? What width is it? Is it curly or bend or twisted like an old gnarled branch? Design the wand, draw it life size with any runes you want. Think about the Angle- Saxons or Vikings for ideas. Then have a go at building a life size model.

Language.

Both Harry Potter and Star Wars.

Every species has its own language. In Star Wars and Harry Potter all creatures speak to one another using a different language.

I want you to create your own creature which could be from your favourite film series. You could do this in lego, draw it or if you have the materials use clay or another type of building material. Once you have done that I want a list of ten basic words or phrases which you could use such as Hello, I am, my name is... Write out the words phonetically such as kaa fehah would be said ka-fee-har.

A New Hope spends a lot of time on Tatooine, as any fan knows this is a desert planet. I want you to draw a plan of a home from Tatooine. I am afraid that you may have to do some research which involves watching Star Wars.

Many were simple buildings with a kitchen, lounge, garage for a speeder and somewhere for the droids. Once you have drawn your plan, add some labels then use the plan to build the home. They are mostly square build and many boxes would be a suitable start.

Star Wars

Writing - The Death Star is an iconic piece of Star Wars. So there are a number of writing tasks which could go around this.

1. Write a diary entry as if you were an X-wing pilot. What would they feel or say about attacking the Death Star? This could be done as a video entry!
2. Create a video fact file on an aspect of Star Wars. YouTubers use this format to talk about things which interest their viewers. I often hear the children repeat their catchphrases around the school. Choose an element of Star Wars and create a video blog about it showing pictures, lego figures or ships explaining every detail for someone who is new to the Star Wars universe.
3. Hot tip - If you have a child who struggles to write and you have an i-pad then this might help. On i-pads and i-phones there is an app called notes. You can see lots of legs from your underground outpost. There are 6 speeders with scouts who have two legs each. 3 monsters with 4 legs each. Your scanner shows a total of 44 legs! Work out what's left these will be either Ewoks (2 legs) or monsters (5 legs). How many Ewoks and monsters could there be?
