Dear Parents

Start of term 5 update

I do hope this letter finds you and your families safe and well and you have all managed to enjoy some of the sunshine over Easter. Moreover, I hope that you have all been able to find some space as a family, to process some of the enormous changes that have taken place across the country.

Before any updates, I would like to take this opportunity to thank you all for your kind messages over the last few weeks. It has also been a joy to see the pictures of the children and their work, both through email and Twitter. We miss them all very much.

I also appreciate that as parents, you have all had to manage a huge amount over the last few weeks, without the support of a normal school structure. I have heard from many of our families, some of whom have faced hugely challenging circumstances, and we have been thinking of you all.

Closure

The government announced yesterday that schools will continue to remain closed until further notice; other than to children who are vulnerable, and children whose parents are critical to the Covid-19 response and cannot be safely cared for at home. We remain open and available for any pupils who fit these criteria. Thank you for all the responses to my last letter regarding provision for next week. Learning

I hope that you have found some of the work sent out by the teachers before the Easter holidays helpful. I also appreciate that the future uncertainty is going to present ongoing challenges for many parents, in maintaining a level of education at home, particularly for younger children who may not have such a degree of independence.

From Monday 20th April, the teachers will post new home learning sheets on the school's 'Links to Learning' page. **I will notify parents by text when these are uploaded.** Each class will post a home learning grid with ideas for every subject. This will loosely follow the topics for learning for this term. The teachers have tried to ensure that there is a balance of online and paper based activities, with extension activities for those who may wish to do more. There will also be some activities which children may be able to complete more independently. Teachers will also be posting



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recommended reading lists and other relevant resources specific to their classes.

The teachers will be using two main key online resources: White Rose Maths and Purple Mash.

The White Rose, which we follow in school, is an excellent resource which teaches the children Maths through video lessons. Please do take the time to become familiar with this if you can.

Please try not to worry about your child's learning at this stage. So far, most children across the country have missed between seven to ten days of schooling since before the Easter holidays. As soon as schools are up and running again, we will work hard to ensure any gaps are filled. In this instance the message remains the same: please do what you can and if you need any advice, support, suggestions, extra materials, we are here to help. We do not expect you to teach your children as we would during a normal school day, but anything you can do to help continue some learning at home, would be beneficial.

Over the last three weeks, we have been busy planning a more interactive approach to learning, using an online learning platform. These are not typically used in primary schools, and this has taken some time to implement. I hope to update you on the details as soon possible.

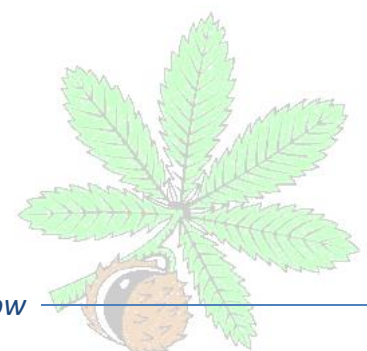
