

# Secondary School Admissions

- ▶ Firstly, we know that this can be an extremely stressful time for both pupils and parents with a whole host of questions to answer.
- ▶ Which school should we choose?
- ▶ Will I get in to the school?
- ▶ Do I live close enough?
- ▶ How do I apply for a place?
- ▶ How does the process work?
  
- ▶ What is important to remember is that this process is about finding the most appropriate school for your child – in fact, it is similar to when you were choosing your child's primary school. You know how difficult that was and this can be even more challenging.

# Applying for a Secondary School Place

- ▶ You will need to complete the Authority's Secondary Common Application Form (Kent SCAF) online or on paper.
- ▶ Paper forms may be returned via the school or direct to the Kent County Council.
- ▶ The website will be available from Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> September and applications need to be submitted by Monday 31<sup>st</sup> October. *Please note: This is a national date, imposed centrally on all Local Authorities.*

- ▶ You can name up to four schools in order of your preference.

# Choosing Schools

- ▶ Choose your schools carefully – 4 in total and it is recommended that you put 4 schools.
  - ▶ Put the schools in your preferred order.
  - ▶ Submit SCAF form before the deadline.
  - ▶ Your decision should be based on which school best suits your child and what is going to enable them to flourish.


# Deciding

- ▶ Remember it is about the best interests of YOUR child. Where is your child going to thrive?
  - ▶ What school is best going to meet their needs?
  - ▶ What school can offer your child a curriculum and a learning approach which will fit with them?

# Tips For Choosing A School

- ▶ Choose the schools that will best meet your child's needs, which may or may not be a Grammar School.
  - ▶ Keep an open mind.
  - ▶ Visit the schools – check their websites for open days and tours.
  - ▶ Talk to your child, talk to the schools and talk to us.
  - ▶ Look at each school's own admissions criteria.

# Schools to Note

- ▶ The following grammar schools offer places through the Shepway tests (their own tests):
  - Folkestone Grammar School for Girls
  - The Harvey Grammar School for Boys
- ▶ Simon Langton Grammar School for Boys gives priority to those with 20 or more marks above the Kent Test threshold and living within 9 miles of the school.

# The Kent Test (11+)

- ▶ Your child does not need to take the Kent Test unless you and your child are interested in naming a grammar school in your application.
- ▶ The children will take the Kent Test on Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> September.
- ▶ The results are received on Tuesday 18<sup>th</sup> October (after 4pm).
- ▶ The school will support children through the test but cannot coach them for the test.
- ▶ There are three tests:
  - Maths (30 minutes)
  - English (30 minutes)
  - Reasoning (approx. 1 hour)
  - Writing Task
- ▶ Registration for the Kent Test opens on 1<sup>st</sup> June and closes on 1<sup>st</sup> July.

- ▶ If you are in any doubt, register your child for the test – you can withdraw your application up until the morning of the test.

Children due to start secondary school in September 2022 can register for the Kent Test from 1 June 2021.

Assessment is normally done through testing during the autumn term.

The tests are planned for September 2021. # Shepway Test

- ▶ Folkestone School for Girls and The Harvey Grammar School run the Shepway Test.
- ▶ This test gives children a second chance to show that they are of selective ability.
- ▶ The registration form is available on the school websites from 30<sup>th</sup> May – 4<sup>th</sup> July.
- ▶ The Shepway Test is a computer based test which assesses verbal reasoning, non-verbal reasoning and mathematics. Literacy skills are assessed through an extended piece of writing.



# Should My Child Sit the Kent Test?

- ▶ The children have completed Cognitive Ability Test (CATs) which give an indication of how your child is likely to perform. These tests took place this week and we will give you the results at the end of this meeting.
  - ▶ These scores, along with their attainment in school, will help you decide if you wish to register your child.
  - ▶ We are here to answer any questions and support you through this process.
- 

# Special Arrangements

- ▶ Special arrangements can be requested for sitting the test – time/ rest breaks etc or adjustments to the test papers – size/colour etc
- ▶ Please contact Mr Stapley or myself, as soon as possible, if you believe that your child's academic ability may be compromised by their ability to access a test.
- ▶ Any access requirements must be made by the school by the 13<sup>th</sup> July.
- ▶ When you register your child for the Kent Test online, you will need to confirm if you have discussed a request for access arrangements with the school.

# Maths and English Tests

- ▶ The tests are multiple-choice with a separate answer sheet.
- ▶ The first two tests will be an English paper and Maths paper which will take approximately 1 hour.
- ▶ Each section will involve a 5 minute practise exercise followed by a 25 minute test.
- ▶ The English section will involve a comprehension exercise as well as some additional questions designed to test Literacy skills.

# Reasoning Tests

- ▶ The second test is a reasoning paper.
  - ▶ It will take about 1 hour, including the practise sections and questions.
  - ▶ It contains a verbal reasoning and non-verbal reasoning section.
  - ▶ The non-verbal reasoning will be split into short sections.

# Raw Scores and Standardised Scores



- ▶ Each paper is marked based on the number of questions correct – this provides a raw score.
- ▶ The raw scores are then standardised. This means that the scores are weighted to reflect the child's age at the time of taking the test.
- ▶ You will receive 3 scores which are totalled to give an overall score.
- ▶ The threshold mark is different each year. It will be set once the test has been marked and depends on the range of scores.
- ▶ 2021 – the threshold mark was 332+ with no individual score below 108.

# Writing Task

- ▶ There is also a written exercise which will not be marked but may be used by a local headteacher panel as part of the Headteacher Appeals process.
  - ▶ The writing task is 40 minutes, including 10 minutes planning time.
  - ▶ The children get a variety of topics and need to choose one to write about.

# Headteacher Appeal Process

- ▶ If a child does not meet the threshold in the Kent Test, there is still the Headteacher Appeal process.
  - ▶ The school will only appeal for a place where we feel that there is sufficient evidence to support a grammar placement.
  - ▶ The Headteacher Appeal process takes place prior to 'results day' and we are not allowed to let you know if we are appealing or not.

# Results Day

- ▶ You will receive an email or letter saying that your child has:
  - been assessed as suitable for a grammar school placement (G)
  - been assessed as suitable for a high school placement (H)
- ▶ We reassure children that this is not a 'pass' or 'fail' result but an assessment on where they might learn best.
- ▶ Results Day can be stressful for them.
- ▶ Please do not ask us to give you your child's results on Results Day. We can discuss them from the following day.
- ▶ If your child did not sit the Kent Test or was assessed as suitable as H, you can still put a Kent grammar school on your application but that school will be turned down.
- ▶ You will then have the right to appeal to explain why you think a grammar school is a suitable option for your child.
- ▶ The Parental Appeal normally takes place in May.

# Notification

- ▶ Kent notify parents on **Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> March 2023 (National Offer Day)** of the offer of a single school place, and explain how to lodge an appeal if you are not happy with the offer you have received. **Online notifications will arrive by e-mail after 4pm on 1st March; letters will arrive on 3rd March.**
- ▶ **As parents, you will be asked to accept or decline the place offered by 15<sup>th</sup> March 2023.** If no response has been received by then, you will be reminded of the need to respond within a further 7 days if you do not wish to lose your place.
- ▶ **Deadline for lodging an appeal is Tuesday 28<sup>th</sup> March 2023 and reallocation of places by KCC follows.**

# Appeals Process

- ▶ IT IS ALWAYS ADVISABLE TO ACCEPT THE PLACE YOU ARE OFFERED AND THEN APPEAL FROM THIS POINT.
- ▶ You can of course appeal the place your child has been offered and the closing date for an appeal is Tuesday 28<sup>th</sup> March 2023.
- ▶ Parents are able to appeal for a place but not able to appeal against the test scores at this point.
- ▶ Reallocation of places will be done on/or by 25<sup>th</sup> April.

# What Can You Do?

- ▶ Prepare your child by:
  - ▶ looking at verbal and non-verbal exercises
  - ▶ look at English and maths exercises
  - ▶ look at the Kent Familiarisation Booklet
- ▶ Look at online test resources.
- ▶ Make sure your child practises these exercises so that they are familiar with the test format.
- ▶ Make sure they continue reading and writing during the summer holiday.

## Familiarisation Booklet

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
This familiarisation booklet is designed for pupils who plan to take the Kent 11+ test this year. It will help to familiarise you with what to expect by giving a brief description of the different parts of the test, suggestions for how individual question types should be approached and an example of how to record your answers on the separate answer sheet. The example and practice questions that are included here will give you a chance to practise answering different kinds of reasoning, English and maths questions, but will not necessarily be exactly the same question types that will come up in your test. The order in which sections appear may also vary. The purpose of this booklet is to show the kind of challenges that the Kent test will present and to guide you in how best to deal with them.
