



### **Pupil Premium Offer for T&L**

All teachers will know who the disadvantaged children are in their class and will ensure that these children are targeted in Pupil Progress reviews.

The curriculum is well sequenced to allow children to build and remember knowledge over time. Essential knowledge will be identified and lead to clear end points.

Lessons and classrooms will be language rich. The concepts will be discussed and important language explored through examples, use in context, etymology and word breakdown.

PP pupils will receive scaffolding during lessons to ensure they access the knowledge and vocabulary for each lesson to ensure they reach end of year expectations.

In order to ensure that the children feel happy and safe at school, the teacher will talk to each child every day, speaking to them about their lives outside of school and their interests.

Once the children are engaged in a task, the teacher will visit the PP children during the lesson and give verbal feedback. This will include ensuring they understand the vocabulary required for the lesson.

Additional time will be dedicated to parents for PP pupils, beyond the usual parents' evenings, to discuss the child in more detail.

Extra TA hours will fund further provision to work with PP pupils, giving the teacher additional flexibility to work with them also.

Early language interventions will be put in place for EY pupils to ensure that we address the gap as soon as possible.

School trips will be paid for (in part or in full) for Pp children so that they do not miss out on opportunities to develop cultural capital and extend their learning beyond the school.

Interventions will be run to support PP children, tracked through Pupil Progress reviews 3 times a year.

Tuition will be provided for key pupils in English and Maths.

Additional well-being support will be put in place through ELSA and counselling for key PP pupils.

Extra TA/teacher support will be offered within the classroom where necessary.

Metacognition Strategies will be employed across the curriculum.
