	What have we been learning about at school?	What could you do to support at home?
Phonics	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>This week we have continued to look at adjacent consonants in CCVC and CCVC words and have been identifying the blends.</li> <li>We have started to include some digraphs within these words too.</li> <li></li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Practise using the letter cards to make CCVC words and CVCC. Try to use some digraphs eg roast, green, train, scoop, groan, sport etc.</li> <li></li> </ul>
Literacy	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>This week we have been looking at around the world non fiction books to learn about different habitats.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Use a globe or Google Earth to visit some different habitats around the world.</li> </ul>
Maths	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>In Maths this week we have been continuing to focus on the numbers 9 and 10 and use all the numbers up to 10 too.</li> <li>We enjoyed making our own bingo boards and worked out which number each card was representing. There was some great reasoning to match the quantity to the number.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>I have included a blank bingo board and a set of bingo cards. Use the bingo mat to choose 6 numbers between 1 and 10. Then take a card and work out which number the quantity is representing. See if you can say it as a number sentences. E.g. 5 add 2 equals 7.</li> </ul>
Topic  Habitats around the world.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>This week we have had the pleasure of the year 5's every morning. We have worked in pairs with them to design and make a habitat for one of our small world animals.</li> <li>First we chose our animal and researched where they live and what is in their habitat by researching in books. Then we drew our own designs. After that we created our habitats using boxes and different art and craft materials, thinking about colour, shape, form and sometimes texture. Once the habitat was complete we then worked on making a sculpture of the animal we had chosen from clay. We used tools to shape and form the clay and add texture if needed too. After that we then painted our animals. We had such fun doing this and worked really well with our year 5 helpers. Thank you year 5.</li> <li>In PE with coach Harry this week we played cricket. We had great fun running between the wickets!</li> <li>With Ellen in outdoor learning we made our names from sticks and then created some fabulous homes for bugs (thankfully the storm clouds passed us by but the thunder made some of us a little anxious so we stayed close to the building this week)</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Use a globe or Google Earth to visit some different habitats around the world.</li> <li><i>Where in the world would you like to visit?</i></li> </ul>
