| | What have we been learning about at school? | What could you do to support at home? |
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| Phonics | This week we have been looking at words with three adjacent consonants such as in the words splash and trunks. We have been listening carefully for each of the three sounds that make the blend. We have been learning to spell the tricky words he, she, we, be, was and you. | I have included a sheet with CCCVC words. Roll a dice and find the word that matches. Read the word, trying hard to included all the adjacent consonants when you blend them, and then colour that word in. Which row will be coloured in first? |
| Literacy | This week we started looking at our core text; Billy's Bucket. Billy has a magical bucket and in it he can see lots of creatures. We imagined we had a magical bucket and shared out ideas of what would be in it. We painted the creatures we imagined. We also read the story My Dad is Brilliant and created some wonderful cards for Father's Day. We thought of some beautiful messages to go inside. We wrote the insides independently, and have come so far with our writing. | Tell a grown up at home some of the facts you have learnt about creatures under the sea? Can you remember how long a whale shark is? Can you remember if more of the earth is land or water? Is it warmer or colder at the bottom of the ocean or near the surface? If you have age-appropriate non-fiction books at home practise using the contents page to find information. You could also take a trip to the library to find some information books about the sea. |
| Maths | In Maths this week we have continued to look at numbers to 20. We filled tens frames to make quantities to 20. We used numicon to make the teen numbers, using a tens piece and extra ones. We learnt the words column, row and diagonal (see below as to why) | Have fun playing with your Tic-Tac-Toe game and using the words column, row and diagonal to describe how you made your three in a row. |
| Topic Under the Sea. | As it is Father's Day this weekend the children have learnt how to play noughts and crosses and also learnt that is can be called three in a row or tic-tac-toe. As we have learnt a lots about minibeasts the children have made their own tic-tac-toe games as presents for Father's Day. They have been using the positional language column, row and diagonal to describe how they have made 3 in a row. We hope you enjoy them. We have been looking the famous artwork, The Great Wave, by Japanese artist Katsushika Hokusai. We had fun recreating this in 3D using card and paper to make spiral waves. As it has been so hot we have been talking about ways to keep safe in the sun and the importance of this. We watched what happened to Grover in Sesame Street's plant when it got dehydrated! Our eggs are almost ready to hatch and we hope that on Monday we will have some egg-siting news! | Thank you for all your beach and sea uploads to Tapestry.
