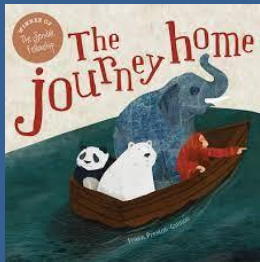

Terms 5 & 6, 2023 Topic title: Explorers

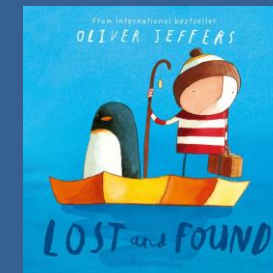
Key Concept Question: Where did Explorers travel around the world and why?

Core Texts



The Journey Home is a poignant look at the experiences and emotions of endangered animals that travel far from home when their habitats are lives are put in danger. It mirrors the current situation in Ukraine and the uncertainty and emotions of refugees who have no idea when they will be able to go back home. Will the Polar Bear and his friends find their way back home?

Lost and Found is a simple tale about a boy and a penguin and their growing friendship. One day, the penguin unexpectedly turns up at the boy's house and the boy presumes he is lost so takes him to the lost and found office. Once they reach the office, he discovers no-one is missing a penguin. So the boy decides to take the Penguin back to the South Pole, but who is lost and who is found?!
