PRIZES FOR LEAVERS 2023

The Prize for English – Emilia

However, Emilia has shone in English this year and achieved the Greater Depth standard in reading, writing and GPS. Her book is normally one of the last ones that I mark so that I always end on an enjoyable, positive – it is a joy to read her writing!

The Prize for Numeracy – Monty

Again, this prize could also have been awarded to many of the Year 6 pupils this year. However, Monty has demonstrated his passion and enthusiasm for all things mathematical. He enjoys the challenge in maths and it has been lovely to see him sharing his explanations of how to solve problems – and I am so pleased that he finally writes down his working out! 
