May I wish you all an enjoyable break and we look forward to seeing the children back in school on Monday 30th October.



their pattern and spot any mistakes. The children were very proud of their efforts!












Neptune class have been learning about input and outputs in Computing. We created posters to show what we have learnt.



# Secondary school in Kent 2024

#### Apply online at kent.gov.uk/secondaryadmissions

Opens Friday 1 September 2023 and closes at midnight on Tuesday 31 October 2023

For children born between 1 September 2012 and 31 August 2013, Transferring to Secondary school in September 2024

#### What to do

#### Choose a school

It's important to find out more about the schools you are interested in before you decide to name them on the application form.

Read the Guide to Secondary admissions at <u>www.kent.gov.uk/</u> secondaryadmissions.

You can name up to four Secondary schools, inside or outside of Kent, but you must name them all on the same application.

#### Apply for a school place

A simple, fast, convenient process which opens Friday 1 September 2023 and closes at midnight on Tuesday 31 October 2023.

If you already have an account set up from the Kent Test process, please use these login details.

You will receive an email confirmation that your application has been submitted correctly and that the LA has received it.

You can log back in at any time to view the information submitted.

#### Receiving your offer

On offer day (Friday 1 March 2024) an email will be sent after 4pm informing you of your offer.

You must accept or decline the school place you have been offered by Friday 15 March 2024.

If we have not offered your child a place in your preferred school, you have the right to appeal. You can also add their name to the school's waiting list if your child is eligible for admission.

Moving house during the application window will likely complicate your application and we therefore advise you to pay special attention to key dates in the admissions process. KCC has no discretionary authority to vary the process for parents who cannot complete address moves in time to make use of them for admissions purposes. If you have queries relating to this, please email the team on one of the email addresses below

Tuesday 31 October 2023	Online application process closes for the main round. Any amendments after this date must be emailed to <a href="mailto:kentonlineadmissions@kent.gov.uk">kentonlineadmissions@kent.gov.uk</a>
Friday 1 March 2024	Offers of school places sent to parents via email after 4pm.
Friday 15 March 2024	Parents should contact the school to accept/refuse the place that has been offered and can use the link in the offer email to ask for their child to be added to the waiting list of eligible schools named on the original application.
Thursday 28 March 2024	Appeals need to be lodged by this date to be heard before September - appeals information can be found at <a href="https://www.kent.gov.uk/schoolappeals">www.kent.gov.uk/schoolappeals</a> . You can only appeal for schools that were named on the application form.
