
Brabourne Champions!

For children born between **1 September 2012** and **31 August 2013**, Transferring to Secondary school in **September 2024**

What to do

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It's important to find out more about the schools you are interested in before you decide to name them on the application form.

Read the Guide to Secondary admissions at <u>www.kent.gov.uk/</u> secondaryadmissions.

You can name up to four Secondary schools, inside or outside of Kent, but you must name them all on the same application.

Apply for a school place

A simple, fast, convenient process which opens Friday 1 September 2023 and closes at midnight on Tuesday 31 October 2023.

If you already have an account set up from the Kent Test process, please use these login details.

You will receive an email confirmation that your application has been submitted correctly and that the LA has received it.

You can log back in at any time to view the information submitted.

Receiving your offer

On offer day (Friday 1 March 2024) an email will be sent after 4pm informing you of your offer.

You must accept or decline the school place you have been offered by Friday 15 March 2024.

If we have not offered your child a place in your preferred school, you have the right to appeal. You can also add their name to the school's waiting list if your child is eligible for admission.

Moving house during the application window will likely complicate your application and we therefore advise you to pay special attention to key dates in the admissions process. KCC has no discretionary authority to vary the process for parents who cannot complete address moves in time to make use of them for admissions purposes. If you have queries relating to this, please email the team on one of the email addresses below.

The East Kent trophies are awarded to the highest-placed players in each section (after to break) where here a shead or she is in LJCC qualification criteria (out of 6):

- Under 8: 4 points
- Under 10 Minor: 3½ points
- Under 10 Major: 4½ points
- Under 12 Minor: 3¹/₂ points
- Under 12 Major: 4½ points

Rules of the tournament:

This will be a 6-round Swiss-system tournament, in which players are systematically paired against one another round by round. It is not a knockout tournament - i.e. all players play in all rounds. If there is an odd number of players in a section, then one player in the draw will receive a full-point bye for that round and, if possible, will be paired for a friendly game instead. (Players score 1 for a win, ½ for a draw, 0 for a loss.)

Digital clocks will be used, and the FIDE Laws of Chess shall apply - e.g. touch-move. All sections will be sent for rapidplay grading with the English Chess Federation, and data is shared with the ECF for this purpose. Tie-break rules will be: (1) Direct Encounter; (2) Median-Buchholz; (3) Buchholz Cut 1; (4) Buchholz; (5) Drawing of lots.

Accessibility

There is disabled parking immediately in front of the hall. The tournament room and waiting areas are all on ground level, and there is a disabled toilet.
