Millie presented to the whole school, telling us the story of her disability and journey to winning over 300 medals in skiing, including 4 x Paralympian and 2x World Championship medals. The visit coincided with our focus on our school value of 'Courage' this term and, following Millie's inspiring talk, the children got to hold some of her Paralympic medals (they are a lot heavier than you may think!).

Millie's visit also coincided with some great news for two of our Y6 pupils who, following various rounds of competitions with other counties, have been named Kent Athletic Champions! Millie presented them with their cups and medals in Collective Worship. We are extremely proud of you both.


fantastic day to look back on our staff and pupils' achievements.
