A sibling link applies to school admissions in Kent County Council (KCC) when a child has a sibling who attends the

- The sibling link is maintained if the family lives in the same house as when the older sibling was admitted.
- The sibling link is also maintained if the family moves within 2 miles of the school.
- The sibling link is broken if the family moves more than 2 miles from the school.
- A sibling link cannot be claimed if the older sibling is in Year 6, as they will be moving to secondary school.

If you know anyone who would be interested in visiting our wonderful school for a place for their child/ren next year, please do spread the word.



Secondary School Applications 2026 (advice from Kent County Council)

For children starting year 7 in September 2026 applications open on Monday 1 September 2025 and will close on Friday 31 October 2025.

You can apply for up to 4 schools.

- Put the schools in the order of preference.
- We strongly recommend you use all 4 preferences on your application form.

 Initially, we are only able to look at schools you have named. If you do not name a local school, families who did name it may fill its spaces. This means it may no longer be an option if we cannot offer you one of your preferred schools.
- Naming only one school does not guarantee your child a place or give priority for a place over another child.
- You are not able to name the same school more than once.

To apply for a school outside of Kent, name the school in your application with other preferences. Your application details will be passed on to the relevant local authority for processing.

Applications are processed between 1 November 2025 and 1 March 2026.

Well done to everyone who nurtured their seeds and watched them grow.





Class News

Mars are continuing to work hard, play hard. In English, we have been thoroughly enjoying 'The Last Wolf' and have re-enacted the characters of The Last Lynx, The Last Bear and The Last Wolf through role play. We have had some great discussions about the importance of trees and what our world would look like without the nature we are so blessed with surrounding our school.



We have completed our first Maths unit of place value. We have conquered number lines and using the symbols greater than, less than and equal to.

We have been accessing our foundation subjects in the afternoon through continuous and enhanced provision. This allows children freedom of choice to complete 'should' and 'could' tasks. Children have had the option to create a piece of artwork depicting the colours of fire linking to our Topic, create a poster by Little Red linking to our English text and exploring greater than/less than using manipulatives, to embed our Maths learning. When children have completed a 'should' and 'could' task to the best of their own ability, they are able to have free choice and direct their own learning, honing in on their creative and social skills.










Neptune have been learning all about forces in Science. This week we conducted experiments to see what material would be the best to coat a ramp with, in order to make

a toy car go a greater distance. Most groups found that the towel was the least effective, because it had more friction and the foil was the most effective, because less friction was produced. Super Science Neptune!!



Jupiter has continued learning about the Maya Civilisation. They were the first to have a symbol to represent zero in the mathematics and they built temples that they painted red because they believed that the temple building was alive. In art this week, we used our technical drawing skills to create a three-dimensional drawing of a Maya temple - it took a great deal of concentration and patience.
