Phonics	<ul> <li>We have begun to learn the single phonemes in level 3 phonics.</li> <li>We have learnt the sound 'j' as in jet, 'v' as in van, 'w' as in web.</li> <li>We have continued to practise recognising the tricky words I, the, to, no and go and have been reading short captions with these words in.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Continue to practise all sounds learnt by word building with them.</li> <li>Build the words jet, jam, job, van, vet, Vic, web, wet, win, fox, six, mix.</li> <li>Once your child has decoded the short sentence or caption in their reading book, encourage them to go back and re-read it for sense and to develop fluency.</li> </ul>
Literacy	<ul> <li>This week we have enjoyed looking at the story of the Gingerbread Man – another traditional tale.</li> <li>Our key vocabulary: leap, soggy, cunning, accelerate, pursue</li> <li>We have looked at a different version of this story and picked out the similarities and differences.</li> </ul>	We enjoyed singing along with the philharmonic orchestra's version of the gingerbread man – watch it here at home too:  BBC Philharmonic: The Musical Story of the Gingerbread Man - BBC iPlayer
Maths	<ul> <li>In Maths this week we have been continuing to use the vocabulary 'one more' and 'one less'.</li> <li>We have been using this vocabulary in games by saying; 'I have one less than you – you have two more than me' etc.</li> <li>We have practised saying one more than 1 is 2, one more than 2 is 3, one less than 5 is 4 etc.</li> <li>We are continuing to explore 'composition of 4 and 5'. This means that one number or amount (the whole) can be made up of smaller numbers (the parts).</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Can you remember what 'one more' and 'one less' means?
